



St Wilfrid's Hospice's care is available to all in our community



What is a hospice? What does the hospice do?

A hospice is a service that gives care and support to people at end of life. This includes medical care, emotional and spiritual support, and help with practical needs.

Who can access our support?

Anyone aged over 18 can access our support. We support people at end of life and help their families and carers too. We also have a children's counselling service, offering support for children and young people who are experiencing the death of a loved one.

Do you have to pay for our services?

No, all of our services and care are free. We are a charity and receive some funding from the NHS, but 70% of our funding is from donations from the local community.

Where do we work?

Our main hospice is in Hampden Park in Eastbourne, but we support people in Eastbourne, Hailsham, Heathfield, Seaford, Uckfield, and the villages around these towns.

Where will I or my family member be cared for?

People can be cared for in the hospice building or we can help you to access support at home. For example, a nurse can visit you or your family member at home to provide advice and help with medication.
